About ProQuest®

Through the **ProQuest** service you have access to *ABI/Inform* (business), *ProQuest Psychology Journals*, *Religious Periodicals* and a full range of subject areas including the Humanities, Social Sciences, Sciences, and more. *ProQuest* provides links to many full-text articles. Some of these articles are available in page image format. This means that you can view the article and its accompanying graphics as if you were looking at the print version of the journal. You will need to use the free Adobe Acrobat Reader in order to view articles in page image format.

About FirstSearch

Through the **FirstSearch** service you have access to such premier databases as *ERIC* (education). In addition to this database, *FirstSearch* provides you with access to 30+ databases covering a full range of subject areas. Most of these databases are periodical indexes, but you will also find directories, company information, and reference resources such as encyclopedias. *FirstSearch* provides links to many full-text articles.

About LexisNexis™

LexisNexis™ provides access to a comprehensive spectrum of full-text information from over 5,600 sources including:

- National and regional newspapers, wire services, broadcast transcripts, international news, and non-English language sources
- U.S. Federal and state case law, codes, regulations, legal news, law reviews, and international legal information
- Shepard's Citations for all U.S. Supreme Court cases back to 1789
- Business news journals, company financial information, SEC filings and reports, and industry and market news

MarketLine includes information on 10,000 companies, 2,000 industries, 50 countries, and News & Comments.

Company Profiles contain: company overviews, business descriptions, company history, executive listings, product listings, locations, news and commentary.

Industry Profiles contain:

- 5 year historical and 5 year forecast market values and/or volumes
- market segmentations
- company and/or product market shares
- explanatory text identifying major trends and significant growth points
- analysis of each market's competitive landscape, including main players, distribution channels and regulatory issues

Country Profiles

Through a unique combination of macroeconomic and industry data, Country Profiles give you quick access to country data points, trends and analysis, including:

- A description of the country's economic performance and GDP

About EBSCOHost History Databases

The EBSCOHost service offers two outstanding history databases that index scholarly journal articles.

- **America: History and Life** is a periodical index to the history of the United States and Canada from prehistory to the present. This extensive database covers over 2,000 journals published worldwide. Abstracts only; no full-text.
- **Historical Abstracts** is a periodical index to the history of the world from 1450 to the present (excluding the United States and Canada, which are covered in *America: History and Life*). Currently over 2,000 journals published throughout the world are covered in this database. Abstracts only; no full text.

About Christian Periodical Index (CPI)

Access the **Christian Periodical Index (CPI)** through EBSCOHost. CPI indexes over 100 selected publications from the broad spectrum of knowledge including science, literature, medicine, music, philosophy, history, sociology, nursing, and education. Coverage is representative of the major doctrinal positions within evangelical Christianity. Index only; no full-text.
